Seven Springs Farm Supply	Open Year Round	Every 3-6 Weeks	We stock most of Seven Spring's inventory, but there's a few items of lesser demand or shorter shelf life that we do not. Order anything to ride along as we restock our store every 3-6 weeks. Orders are price matched with the Seven Springs website as long as products are housed in their Virginia warehouse. (Dropshipped items do not apply.)
Dubois Agroinnovation	November - December	Early January	Dubois' freight charges out of Canada can be steep on their bulkier items like Proteknet, wire hoops, and harvest bins. At least once a year, we place a +\$10,000 group order which qualifies us for wholesale pricing and free freight. We match their online pricing; no added fees. Option to pay in December as a tax write-off for the following year.
SPRING Greenhouse Plastic	December - January	March	6 mil, UV stabilized, 4-year greenhouse plastic. Order a variety of sizes that we do not stock at our best pricing. Infrared, anticondesate options available with a minimal upcharge.
FALL Greenhouse Plastic	March - April	Late Summer - Early Fall	6 mil, UV stabilized, 4-year greenhouse plastic. Order a variety of sizes that we do not stock at best pricing. Infrared, anticondesate options available at a minimal upcharge.
Hardwood Tomato Stakes	December - January	March	We're working with a local farmer with a sawmill to cut and sharpen 1in x 1in x6 ft hardwood stakes. Pre-ordering is a must as he is milling these to order for us.
Silage Tarps	December - January	March	Order 32ft, 40ft, and 50ft x 100ft silage tarps when we place our annual restocking order and receive 10% off our regular in stock price.
Shade Cloth	December - January	April	Custom order special sizes, shade %, and grommet spacing, and save big on freight by pooling your order collectively with other farmers.
Agribon Row Cover	August - September	Early October	Source sizes we typically do not carry in-store and save ~10-25% over normal pricing. Joining our annual truckload Agribon order gives you access to giant, bulky rolls without massive freight charges.
Stuewe & Sons	November - December	Early January	Pool nursery supply orders to achieve better volume pricing collectively and save on freight. This truck comes from Oregon. Option to pay in December as a tax write-off for the following year.
Tenax	January - February	March	Opportunity to order Tenax products that we don't normally stock, like different specs and sizes of plastic fencing and bulk rolls of Hortonova.
T.O. Plastics & Growscapes	August - September	December - January	Collaborate with us during trade show season to order pots, inserts, plug trays and more from TO Plastics and Growscape (formerly HC). Idaho Potatoes (Certified Organic)	November - December	Late February	One shot at ordering 30+ different varieties of organic certified seed potatoes from Grand Teton Organics shipped from Idaho straight to our door. Potatoes arrive dormant so they can be stored or immediately green sprouted.
SPRING Alliums (Certified Organic & Conventional)	November - December	Late February	Both Conventional and Organic onion bunches that produce bulbs; onion sets that produce green/spring onions, and shallots.
Sweet Potato Slips (Certified Organic)	March - April	Late May	~7 organic certified varieties field harvested at Burch Farms in Eastern NC and in our hands within 24 hours of harvest. Distributed within 48 hours of arrival.
Strawberry Plugs (Currently Conventional; Seeking Organic)	June	Late September - Early October	Rooted in soil in plug trays of 50 or 1/2 trays of 25, these plants have more shelf life and are easier to transplant than cut offs.
Strawberry Cut Offs (Approved for organic production)	January - Ruby Junes June - Fronteras	Early - Mid October	Cut Offs are bare roots whose foliage has been "cut off" to make transplanting easier. Lassen Canyon sends them straight to our door within hours of harvesting in Northern California. Cut offs are highly perishable, and we strive to have orders in the hands of farmers within 48 hours of their arrival.
FALL Alliums (Certified Organic & Conventional)	July-August	Early - Mid October	Seed garlic, onion sets that produce green/spring onions, and shallots. Multiple organic and conventional garlic varieties are available. Fall onion sets and shallots are conventional.

Trees & Shrubs

Fall Fruit Trees	Early June	Fall	Selections vary by season and availability, but typically include: Dwarf Apple, Apricot, Cherry, Fig, Hazelnut, Nectarine, Olive, Peach, Pear, Persimmon, Plum, Blackberry, Blueberry, Raspberry, and Serviceberry.
Bare Roots (Trees & Shrubs)	August - December	Mid January	Bare root plants are dormant, young plants with no root ball. It's crucial to get them planted, potted up or healed into a mound of soil as soon as you get them. Selection varies by year and availability, but typically include: Serviceberry, Pawpaw, Flowering Dogwood, Fringe Tree, Carolina Silverbell, Sweetbay Magnolia, Black Cherry, Sassafras, and a variety of native shrubs.
